

Day 3 May 17, 2018

We both enjoyed a good night's rest and awoke about 6:00 a.m. ready to put things in order so we could start the day. Vlad came about 7:30 a.m. and we went to breakfast. The little restaurant is close and it had menus in English. Vlad and I both ordered what the menu said was "American Breakfast" but Ava opted for the "Mexican Breakfast."

The "American Breakfast" consisted of, scrambled eggs, which were very good, very under cooked bacon, which I chose not to eat, some kind of link sausage, it was tasty, pork and beans, which was the first time this American ever had pork and beans for breakfast, and toast. The Mexican Breakfast had scrambled eggs, which were the same as mine, grilled mushrooms, which Ava said were delicious, some kind of green salsa, which was olive oil with some Italian herbs and toast. There were no tortillas and not a speck of cheese. The overall experience was good just not what we would expect from the titles on the menu.

Then it was off to the grocery store. The stores have advanced light years since my first visit to Ukraine. They are much more modern and have a much better selection than I have ever seen here but some things are still confusing to us. For the next several days, Ava will be handling the cooking chores for us. We are staying in the basement of the church building. We have a nice room, The shower room and the rest room are just down the hall. The fellowship hall has a nice one person kitchen so we are now set in those areas.

Yesterday afternoon we met with Vlad and Oksana and mapped out the lessons that we will be teaching for the rest of the time we are here. Vlad typed it out and gave us a copy. Today we are hoping he will translate it into English. Ava will be doing a series of classes on raising children from how God was a parent to Adam and Eve. We will both be working on lessons on "Intentional Marriage." I will also have some sermons and Bible classes. When I asked if there were any special things they would like me to address the answer was, "Anything in the Bible between Genesis and Maps."
