So, they went to a nice dine-in restaurant in St. Louis and in the process drove by numerous wonderful places to eat that weren't open. They were closed because of fear.

Fear has gripped our world to a greater degree than at any other time in my life. We are afraid of something that we all recognize in pictures yet, we are afraid of it because we can't see it with unaided vision. Wouldn't it be a different battle if we could see this virus in the air? recklessness or calculated caution? We hear a lot about Science and our responsibility to follow the guidelines for suspension that were put forth by the different health organizations. We did suspend some of our services in 2020. Why? At first it was because of the pandemic. Now, I'm asking myself if that is still the reason? We did comply with the Governor's initial order. Then we, over a period of weeks, went back to our full schedule. In November, we cut back again because of the rapid rise in the number of new cases in Oklahoma. Yet, I still go to the bakery most mornings. Ava and I both go to the grocery store when we need something. Most weeks we also go out to eat at least once.
